Is the Bible inerrant? If so, why is it important for the Bible to be inerrant?

2 Timothy 3:16, "All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness" (NASB). The ESV reads, "All Scripture is God-breathed."

Either translation is from the Greek phrase, "θεόπνευστος theopneustos" or God-breathed. "θεός theos" is God in Greek, and "πνεῦμα pneumas" is breathed. Literally, Scripture is breathed from the mouth of God. If we do not believe that Scripture is inerrant, then the rest of the verse is irrelevant. We can do whatever we want and live however we want because if the Bible is not inerrant, then it is not authoritative or truthful. It is nothing more than another religious work of literature. But, the Bible is inerrant because "God is not a man that he should lie." (Numbers 23:19), so we can trust the Word of God for "teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness." (2 Timothy 3:16b NASB). That is for every area of our life. The Bible reproofs or convicts Christians of our sins, showing us the correct way to live and how to live a righteous lifestyle.

The issue with the belief that the Bible is not inerrant is sinful man does not want to have authority exercised over him. They, as our Lord said, "loved the darkness rather than the light because their works were evil." (John 3:19 ESV). Biblical Christianity is focused on the Glory of God, whereas man-centered Christianity is focused on man's free will. We are fortunate to have easy access to the Word of God. May we never belittle it to a man-inspired book.



IT'S A SILVER THREADS FIELD TRIP!!!


